Twila's April Tip:



Let's Roll

Todd Beamer was a passenger on United Flight No. 93 when it crashed into the ground in a field in Pennsylvania. Todd and Lisa were a Christian couple, both graduates from Wheaton College and they had two boys age 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ and 19 months and one on the way. Lisa and Todd each had jobs with Oracle Corporation, the worlds 2nd largest computer software Co. The company had given Todd and Lisa with



about 500 other personal a Roman Holiday where they went to Italy for about one week. This was both a work and pleasure holiday. They came home the night before the four planes were hijacked with two planes flying into the world trade center towers. One plane flew into the Pentagon building and the fourth plane went down in a Pennsylvania. Todd Beamer had left that morning on a flight to California for a business meeting. This was United Flight No 93. Four hijackers took over this plane and directed it toward the US Capital. Officials believe with information gathered from cell phone calls made to each other on the plane and other calls that Todd Beamer was instrumental in organizing a group of passengers to overpower the hijackers so that the plane would not reach the capital. Instead it crashed in the Pennsylvania field with no survivors.

STRAIGHT UP...

"And [the risen Christ] said to them, 'Go into all the world and preach the Gospel to every creature. He who believes and is baptized will be saved; but he who does not believe will be condemned." Mark 16: 15-16, NKJV

In the Gospel accounts of the crucifixion, death, and burial of Jesus, we encounter a small group of women on Sunday morning on their way to the borrowed tomb where the body of Jesus had been laid. They are on their way that they might anoint His body as an act of love, as a sign of their grief, and, more pragmatically, as a way to reduce the smell of decomposition in the heat of a Palestinian tomb. This sim-

ple truth — that the women, early on Sunday morning, were on their way to anoint Jesus' body — points to the truth that they, in no way, anticipated His bodily resurrection. Rather, they were going to the tomb to mourn Jesus' death, a death they had witnessed first hand on Friday when He cried out from the cross, "It is finished!' And bowing His head, He gave up His spirit" (John 19: 30b, NKJV). In fact, there one concern that morning was who might remove the stone from the tomb's entrance so they could do what they were prepared to do.

Upon arriving at the tomb, the women found, not death and decay, but life and renewal and, with that, hope. They found the light of Jesus shining into the darkness of their despair and doubt, fear and shame. They found a Savior who recognizes our brokenness and need and, as the source of all love — the fount of all comfort — a Savior who is *present*. In the risen Christ, the women who came to the tomb that Sunday morning were blessed to encounter the One who had *entered* their suffering, overcoming their sin and shame — triumphing over it — and, in so doing, they were blessed to find their rest. This, however, would not be a rest *from* something, but a rest *in* Someone — a rest in the full assurance of the salvation we receive in Christ; a rest in His presence. And, as such, Mary was instructed not to cling to the risen Christ, but resting in Him, to go and bear testimony to the truth that Jesus has died, that Jesus is risen, and that Jesus will come again.

The resurrection of Christ then calls us to bear testimony! First, we are invited to "tell the brethren" — to share our story of new life in Christ with our brothers and sisters with whom we share the fellowship of faith. And, second, we are instructed to "go into all the world," confirming our testimony with signs — confirming our testimony by the way that we live and move and have our being in the world; confirming our testimony by the practice and application of the truth such that people are raised up to new and abundant life in Christ ... such that people are healed! In the presence of the risen Christ, we are to take up our cross and follow, dying to ourselves and being raised to new life in Him. The power of our testimony then is found, not in our strength, but in trusting — allowing Christ, by the power of the Holy Spirit, to work in and through us — and embracing the truth that "our lives are to be lived by faith. We do not live by what we see in front of us" (2 Corinthians 5: 7, NLV).

In simple terms then, we do not live as those without hope, grasping for the things of this world. Rather, we live in the full assurance of the One "who died for us, so that whether we are awake or asleep, we will live at the same time with Him. Therefore [Scripture exhorts us] encourage one another and build each other up, just as indeed you are doing" (1 Thessalonians 5: 10-11, LEB). Live as an expression of Christ's enduring love sharing the fullness of who Jesus is in communion with God and in community with one another. Live in the blessing of resurrection!


On Sunday, March 26, 2017 (after a slight delay due to illness), we celebrated the
