"Beauty in the Brokenness"

SCRIPTURE READING: 1 Corinthians 3: 1-17 (Pew Bible p. 603)

1 Corinthians 13: 4-8a – "Love suffers long and is kind; love does not envy; love does not parade itself, is not puffed up; does not behave rudely, does not seek its own, is not provoked, thinks no evil; does not rejoice in iniquity, but rejoices in the truth; bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never fails." (NKJV)

Isaiah 32: 16-18 – "... justice will dwell in the wilderness, and righteousness remain in the fruitful field. The work of righteousness will be peace, and the

effect of righteousness, quietness and assurance forever. [God's] people ... [dwelling] in a peaceful habitation, in secure dwellings, and in quiet resting places." (NKJV)

Isaiah 25: 6b – "... a feast of choice pieces, a feast of wines on the lees, of fat things full or marrow, of well-refined wines on the lees." (NKJV)

Isaiah 41: 10 – "Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you, yes, I will help you, I will uphold you with My righteous right hand." (NKJV)

Isaiah 52: 7-10 – "How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of him who brings good news, who proclaims peace, who brings glad tidings of good things, who proclaims salvation, who says to Zion, "Your God reigns!" Your watchmen shall lift up their voices, with their voices they shall sing together; for they shall see eye to eye when the Lord brings back Zion. Break forth into joy, sing together, you waste places of Jerusalem! For the Lord has comforted His people, He has redeemed Jerusalem. The Lord has made bare His holy arm in the eyes of all the nations; and all the ends of the earth shall see the salvation of our God." (NKJV)

In Christ, we are	,

- 1 Corinthians 3: 23 "... [we] are Christ's and Christ is God's." (NKJV)
- **Peter 2: 23-24** "who, when He was reviled, did not revile in return; when He suffered, He did not threaten, but committed Himself to Him who judges righteously; who Himself bore our sins in His own body on the tree, that we, having died to sins, might live for righteousness by whose stripes [we] were healed." (NKJV)

Isaiah 61: 1-3 – "The Spirit of the Lord God is upon Me, because the Lord has anointed Me to preach good tidings to the poor; He has sent Me to heal the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to those who are bound; to proclaim the acceptable year of the Lord, and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all who mourn, to console those who mourn in Zion, to give them beauty for ashes, the oil of joy for

mourning, the garment of praise for the spirit of heaviness; that they may be called trees of righteousness, the planting of the Lord, that He may be glorified." (NKJV)

In Christ, we are____

- **Peter 2: 1-5** "Therefore, laying aside all malice, all deceit, hypocrisy, envy, and all evil speaking, as newborn babes, desire the pure milk of the word, that you may grow thereby, if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is gracious. Coming to Him as to a living stone, rejected indeed by men, but chosen by God and precious, you also, as living stones, are being built up a spiritual house, a holy priesthood, to offer up spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ." (NKJV)
- **Peter 3: 9** "[return] evil for evil or reviling for reviling, but on the contrary blessing, knowing that [we] were called to this, that [we] may inherit a blessing." (NKJV)
