Freeman Academy will present the play **The Amish Project** by Jessica Dickey on **November 16 and 17 at 7:00 p.m.** in Pioneer Hall. This serious play is a fictional exploration of a real event that took place in Nickel Mines, Pennsylvania, on October 2, 2006, when a man walked into an Amish one-room schoolhouse and shot 10 girls. The play highlights the forgiveness and grace the Amish people showed the family of the shooter that began the healing process for all. Following the play will be a 15 minute "talk back" with the cast. The mature content of this play is not appropriate for young children.

Children in grades 1-8 can **experience a half-day at Freeman Academy** with a Bearcat Buddy of the same age. Children will experience homeroom, art, choir, and chapel before eating lunch with their buddy. Chapel features pastor and artist John Warden speaking on Romans 12 which includes FA's 2018-2019 theme verse: "Be devoted to one another in love. Honor one another above your selves." Pastor Warden will pose the question, "Do people see this picture (based on Romans 12) of Jesus in you?" and then he will paint a 4x8 canvas with Jesus's face.
