Sermon on the Mount Mennonite Church invites you to join in celebrating a special **liturgy of lament and remembrance for refugees and victims of oppression** on Monday, December 28 at 7pm in their chapel in Sioux Falls. This is the date in the Christian calendar known as the Feast of the Holy Innocents which remembers the infants killed by Herod in an attempt to rid the threat of Christ. They are considered to be the first martyrs of the Church. We will remember their witness, and pray for all victims of state-supported oppression and violence in song, story, and the sharing of bread and cup.

The Conflict Management Support Team of Central Plains Mennonite Conference will be leading a Conflict in the Church: Entrusted with the Message of Reconciliation workshop on January 15-16, at Salem-Zion Mennonite in Freeman, SD. This workshop will begin on Friday evening at 7:00pm and will continue on Saturday from 9:00-4:00pm. This workshop will look at the Nature and Role of Conflict and teach Interpersonal Skills for Managing Conflict.
