Our **season of Lent** began this past week on Ash Wednesday, a day set aside in the church calendar as a reminder of our finite, dependent, and broken existence. We are dust, filled with God's breath. We then embark from Ash Wednesday into the Lenten Journey, 40 days of testing and fasting and re-focusing and repenting and going without in order to create space for God. Our Lenten theme is "Created in the Image of God, Shaped by Jesus" from the Leader magazine. "We are surrounded by a host of pressures that squeeze and contort us into less-than-human, even inhuman, shapes and disfigurements. Lent is a season to release that pressure, to repent of (turn from) all that would distort and reduce our humanity. It is a season of fasting where we choose to abstain from food, television, social media, or whatever may be holding our lives too tightly in its grip. Likewise, in this season, we pay special attention to Christian disciplines: prayer, solitude, Bible Study, simplicity, and service. Yet we also remember that we cannot reshape ourselves. In themselves, these disciplines do not reshape us; they do not restore our authentic humanity. They simply open space in our lives for God to work. Our Creator will recreate us. Jesus' life, death, and resurrection call us and transform us into a new way of being human. We become human, indeed we are reborn, as the Spirit breathes life into us, a life that bursts forth from deep within like a stream of living water.

Please think about young people in your congregation who have demonstrated Jesus's way of love and peacemaking. This year the Central Plains Peace and Justice Task Group is doing the **Peace Mug Award** a little differently. We are seeking young nominations for the Conference's Peace Mug. We are looking for an emerging peacemaker. This can be anyone in their teens and twenties that you have seen doing small acts of peacemaking and kindness or who has spoken out in the face of injustice. The **Dordt University Wind Symphony** from Sioux Center, Iowa, invites you to a concert at 7:30 p.m. on Friday, March 10, at the Trinity Reformed Church in Sioux Falls.
