Peter's encouragement to these church communities and specifically to servants/slaves, wives of non-Christian husbands, and Christian husbands can be a bit jarring for our present culture. Some of the specific advice has been used to hurt, abuse, and perpetuate unhealthy relationships in church and family.

At the heart of this part of Peter's letter is the example of Christ Jesus, who respected and valued all people and did not return harsh words or actions in kind. Instead, Jesus creatively responds in nonviolent, hopeful love.

What would you write to the community as a whole? How would your words reflect the example of the nonviolently loving and truly caring Christ Jesus?
