

Beautiful Bodies pt. 4

In my last article for the Connection, I ended with a note about the scars from our lives that will be carried with us beyond the last day into the time of resurrection when heaven and earth are merged as one, and we see things clearly. I wonder about what scars that I will carry with me into the resurrection because of what I have read about Jesus's scars in the gospels.

After the experiences at the empty tomb, Jesus visits the disciples on the hill in Galilee in Matthew, in the upper room and along the road to Emmaus in Luke, and along the Sea of Galilee in John. Jesus has been raised and appears as any other human being, eating and drinking and sharing life with the disciples. Yet in other moments, Jesus is able to move about without notice, seemingly entering locked rooms without detection and still in disguised appearance as the two on the way to Emmaus testify. One particular moment really sticks with me about the resurrected body of Jesus, which is that the scars from his suffering are still apparent as he shows to Thomas.

So maybe this is the kind of moment that Paul references in 1 Corinthians 15 when he talks about the transformation of resurrection, that we will all be changed, that the mortal body will put on immortality. Something of the present will carry forward into the great day of resurrection, and as we see in Jesus, some of our scars too, some of the signs of sin and evil's effects on all of us will still be noticeable in our resurrected/renewed bodies.

What we know for sure is that all of this is a mystery as Paul tells the church in Corinth. Using the witness and testimony of those who experienced the risen Christ, Paul is drawing his best vision for what the renewal of creation will be like. Just like the Corinthians and the churches that received Peter's first letter, I firmly hope in the promise and assurance of resurrection one day, while still caring for my heart, mind, spirit, and body today because just as I am a steward or caretaker of the universe, so I am a steward of my life, seeking to care for and maintain my whole self even in the midst of life's brokenness because I know that one day, my whole being (scars and hurts included) will be transformed by God.
