Currently, Kerry is the Director of Global Knowledge Management at Habitat, supervising a remote team with staff based from Nairobi, Kenva to Boise, Idaho. The team of eight includes members with expertise in Library Science, Automation, Data Analysis, Adult Learning, User Experience, Governance/Compliance, Information Technology, Technical Writing and Copy Editing. During her first 20 years of employment with Habitat, Kerry traveled around the U.S. training Habitat boards of directors on a wide range. Kerry splits her time between a small barnyard near Bridgewater, where she chases goats out of the gardens and Emery, where her husband Wes is the High School science teacher, and their youngest daughter Lily is a freshman. Wes and Kerry met in 1990 as Peace Corps Volunteers in Africa, serving as Fisheries Extension Agents to help local farmers increase the yield of tilapia in their aquaculture ponds.
