Some suggestions include cold sliced meats; cheese slices or chunks; fresh cold, cut veggies; cut fresh fruit; dips; sauces; sliced breads with or without toppings; crackers; dried fruits; nuts; candies; cookies; snack items; pickles; and olives. When you think of finger foods, the list is endless, and the delectable variety that we offer each other will be fun to taste and experience. On that Sunday morning, November 17, please bring your contribution of charcuterie food to the kitchen area downstairs when you arrive at church.

#### HHM&A program—focus on Native perspective of 150th.

With 2024 marking the 150th anniversary of the start of the wave of Germans from Russia immigrants to this region, Heritage Hall Museum & Archives has focused on that story.

But another aspect of that migration story belongs to those who were here long before Europeans arrived, the Native Americans. The museum has invited a panel of individuals to share their unique perspectives **TODAY** at the Freeman Community Center, starting at 3 p.m.

Titled "150 Years; A Native Perspective," panelists will include Jerome Kills Small, an elder from Pine Ridge; Paisley Sierra, a Native liaison with Vermillion Public Schools; and Bobby Johnson, Lakota traditions teacher at Roosevelt High School in Sioux Falls. Rose Bazemore, activist and speaker from Vermillion, will facilitate the conversation.
